ESS reception centres/resiliency centres

Reception Centres provide immediate assistance with accommodations, food, and medical or prescription support. Please call Emergency Social Services at 1-800-585-9559 to confirm availability or find out about other locations where Emergency Social Services may be available. Read the evacuation order for your area to find out location of the nearest reception centre.

Resiliency Centres and Information Centres provide information, government and non-government resources, insurance advice, counselling, and other supports for wildfire evacuees.

Evacuee registration/finding people

All evacuees should register with the [Red Cross](#), even if aid is not required by evacuees. This allows family and friends to know the whereabouts and safety of loved ones, and allows the Red Cross to contact people directly as more info and assistance becomes available.

Evacuees should also register in person at an ESS Reception Centre if they are in need of immediate assistance with accommodations, food, and medical or prescription support. All evacuees in Prince George are requested to register at the **Prince George ESS Reception Centre** located at Service Centre at City Hall, [1100 Patricia Boulevard](#).

[Northern Health](#) is providing expanded services and hours at Prince George health clinics:

- Nechako Medical Clinic (in the Spruceland Mall at 761 Central Street) - open from 1 pm to 9 pm Monday to Friday, 9 am to 7 pm Saturdays, and 10 am to 7 pm Sundays.

- Salveo Medical Clinic (inside the Real Canadian Superstore at 2155 Ferry Avenue) - open from 8 am to 7 pm Monday to Friday and 9 am to 3 pm Sundays.

[PG Transit](#) buses are free to evacuees, and a free shuttle bus is operating between CNC and the Northern Sport Centre, connecting evacuees at both locations.

[BC SPCA](#) is partnering on rescue efforts for animals in evacuated areas. To provide information about animals that were left behind in evacuated areas, call 1-855-622-7722 between 9 am and 5 pm daily.

[Canadian Disaster Animal Response Team \(CDART\)](#) assists with the rescue and shelter of animals, including pets, horses and livestock. Homeowners and ranchers affected by the Finlay Creek wildfire can contact CDART locally at 250-215-3259 for assistance.

[BC's Emergency Livestock /Animal Evacuation Group](#) was created for evacuees who need help and for those who are able to offer help.

[YMCAs](#) across BC (Kamloops, Prince George, Kelowna, Vancouver Island, Vancouver, Surrey) are open to evacuees for showers, rest, and taking part in drop-in programs. ID with photo and home address required to participate. YMCA of Northern BC is at 2020 Massey Drive, Prince George.

[Pharmacists](#) are able to provide a drug without a prescription during a state of emergency. The College of Pharmacists of BC [Find a Pharmacy tool](#) helps patients locate a pharmacy in the community they are staying.

[BC Ferries](#) is providing free prearranged travel for people evacuating from officially evacuated areas. To book ferry travel, call 1-888-BCFERRY (1-888-223-3779). [BC Disaster Financial Assistance \(DFA\) Program](#), Emergency Management BC, provides financial assistance to help replace or restore essential items and property after a disaster.
